## **Evacuation Procedure for PCGA Volunteers**

### 2021 March

The following information for Charity Volunteers working a bingo assignment at Play! Gaming & Entertainment is taken from the facility's official fire plan.

#### IF YOU HEAR THE FIRE ALARM:

- Remain calm
- Evacuate building immediately through the nearest exit
- Close all doors behind you to reduce the spread of fire and smoke
- Proceed to The Apartment Building (West Side Stories) across the parking lot

<u>Inform the Chief Fire Warden</u> if you have information about the emergency situation or persons requiring assistance in the building.

<u>Do not return</u> to the building until it is declared safe to do so by the <u>Chief Fire Warden or the</u> Fire Department.

#### CHIEF FIRE WARDEN

For the purposes of this section of the Fire Safety Plan, from 8 AM until closing, the Session Manager will be considered the Chief Fire Warden unless the General Manager is on site. The Chief Fire Warden is responsible for the following:

# IN THE EVENT OF FIRE, OR THE ACTIVATION OF THE FIRE ALARM, the Chief Fire Warden shall:

- Ensure that the fire alarm has been activated and not silenced until the fire department has arrived and assumed control of the emergency situation.
- Ensure that Kingston Fire & Rescue has been notified by calling 9-1-1.
- Supervise the evacuation of building occupants, where necessary ensuring those persons requiring assistance are accommodated. Ensure that all washrooms are checked.
- Ensure that all business units in the building are notified of the situation and their units are evacuated. Ensure that all washrooms are checked.
- Ensure that the Fire Department access route is clear and any necessary keys are available.
- Provide relevant information pertaining to the emergency situation to the fire department upon their arrival.
- Account for all staff, customers, and volunteers with the assistance of designated Fire Wardens.
- Give the "All CLEAR" signal for occupants to return to the building, only after notification from the Fire Officer in charge that it is safe to do so.
